Participants: 50 Master and PhD students or BA students with special minors or honours programmes. There are 15 slots available for Indonesian students, 20 for other students from the 'global South', and 15 slots for Dutch and other students from the 'global West'.

Course description: Postcolonial and transnational perspectives on the colonial past of Indonesia and other former colonies via the study of historical and literary and new media sources like novels, movies, oral histories, monuments in and around Yogyakarta from past and present, discussed in dialogues with Indonesian and Dutch writers. Their works of fiction have developed more or less separately from each other. This Summerschool intends to bring the two in conversation with each other, departing

from the seminal literature like Ashcrofts 1989 essay on 'The Empire Writes Back' and others.

Location: University of Gadjah Mada (and online)

Learning goals:

Becoming familiar with theories and debates in the field of intertextuality, transnational and postcolonial studies, focused on Southeast Asia and Europe, with a special focus on Indonesia and the Netherlands.

Becoming familiar with themes in Indonesian and Dutch (post)independence literature from past and present.

Promoting dialogues between Indonesian, Dutch and other writers, scholars and students.

Course structure

The duration of the course is two weeks: six days of lectures, two days of excursions and two days of presentation of research by the students.

The lectures are comprised of introductory courses on intertextual, postcolonial

and transnational theories and the study of literary works and sources from Indonesian, Dutch and other (post)colonial literatures.

Since the summerschool programme will provide a comparative perspective on the transnational nature of national (post) colonial literatures with Indonesian/Dutch perspectives as a case in point, the participation of each student to contribute to the discussion using the examples and insights of their own history and literature is essential for the success of the lectures. Each student will be encouraged to break away from his or her national group and cultivate a distance in order to place himself/herself in a broader international perspective.

During the summerschool the students will meet with members of several communities in Yogyakarta and participate in some form of activities, from having lunch in a restaurant to cultural activities. Both the meeting and activities can hopefully create new linkages.

Participation

Participation is open to bachelor, master, and PhD students from the two participating universities, UGM and VU, and other universities in the world. Selection will take place, based on the information students provide with their application (see below).

Participation is free of charge and includes lunches during course days. Costs for travel, subsistence, and excursions however should be borne by students themselves. As an indication of local costs, we give: Housing: € 25 per night, Ramayana Ballet € 12,50, excursion to Borobudur and Prambanan: € 30. These local costs should be paid on site.

For Dutch students there are several bursaries available to cover part of their travel and housing expenses. See below for more information.

Admission requirements

- Students need to be enrolled as a PhD/ degree/exchange/minor student at either UGM or VU or other universities at the time of the summer course.
- Students need to have a relevant educational background
- Students need proficiency in English
- A completed registration form including the following annexes
- CV, max 2 pages
- Video pitch in mpeg format of max 60 seconds, explaining why you should be selected for the summer course

- Position paper of max 300 words with your take on (post-)colonial literature
- If applicable: a motivated request of 1 page max for a € 500 bursary (see below)

Bursaries

The organizers have made a number of bursaries available of € 500,- each for Dutch students to help to partially cover the costs of travel and subsistence. There are not enough bursaries for all students, so in the event you want to apply for a bursary a motivation for your request is required as an annex to your application form.
